### **Fused Applique Portrait Quilts**

Wed & Thur 2 day workshop

### Lea McComas—Featured Teacher

Create a portrait quilt from your own photo. Learn the basics of portrait composition and how to manipulate a digital image to produce a pattern for a portrait quilt. The workshop will also include instruction on fabric selection for pictorial projects. Quilters will cut fabrics and use a fused, raw-edge applique technique to create an amazing life-like portrait quilt approximately 18-inches in length and width, and will do limited quilting to complete the piece. Lea will also provide instruction on how to edit photos and prepare digital files for use in making the pattern. Due to time constraints, each person will send Lea 2-3 digital photos at least 2 weeks prior to the workshop so that she can edit and prepare a printout for their use in making a pattern. A \$5 kit fee will be paid to the instructor at the workshop.

#### Each participant needs to bring:

- \*Light table
- Freezer paper, approx. 18" x 24"

• 5 fat quarters of fabrics in the same color, but different values: 1 very light, 1 very dark, 1 in

the middle, and 1 between middle and light, 1 between middle and dark. If you want to play safe, go with grays or flesh tones. If you feel like living dangerously, go with bright, or nonflesh colors. NO BOLD PRINTS.

- 1 fat quarter fabric for backing
- 1 fat quarter thin, white muslin
- tulle, at least 15" x 24"
- a piece of batting approx. 15" x 24"
- a mechanical pencil with plenty of lead
- Highlighter
- Red colored pencil with hand sharpener
- Pencil eraser
- scissors for cutting paper, cutting fabric, cutting small areas and tight curves (embroidery scissors work well here)
- Tape (masking or painters)
  2 yards of fusible web (Steam a Seam Lite 2 or Misty Fuse recommended)

**Thread Painted Portraits** 

#### Sewing Machine

### Lea McComas—Featured Teacher

Use free-motion stitching on a printed fabric foundation to thread paint a portrait. Begin with a basic blending and contour exercises before moving on to the stitching individual facial features. Learn how to select appropriate threads and how stitching lines can be blended and contoured to create a realistic facial image. Additionally, learn tricks for adding detail and ways of manipulating the background to support the overall composition. The workshops also includes instruction on photo editing, as well as larger, more complex, or multiple projects. A \$10 kit fee will be paid to the instructor at the workshop.

#### Each participant needs to bring:

- A sewing machine in good working order with a free-motion foot
- Machine needles (size 90/14 is recommended, but bring some 80/12's and 100/16 if you have them)
- Several bobbins filled with a neutral or medium gray thread (4-5 recommended). I suggest you use a thinner thread, 50-60 wt., or a thread specifically designed for use in the bobbin, such as Bottom Line or Mettler Bobbin Fil. Some bobbin threads come in only black and white. If you use these, I suggest 2 bobbins of each.
- 150-250 yd spools of thread (40-wt recommended) in the following colors:
  - White
  - Black
  - Light gray
  - Medium gray
  - Dark gray
  - Red
  - Yellow
  - Blue
  - Green
- Spool(s) of thread to refill bobbins.
- Scissors for cutting thread
- A power strip/extension cord for your machine
- Pen and paper for notes
- Mechanical pencil or fabric marking pen (Frixion pen works great) for marking on portrait panel
- Small trash bin, bag, or box for collecting loose threads
- \*A list of other optional items will be provided upon registration.



### W-1 AM Half Day **3-D Art Quilting: Create a Vase**

Machine & Hand Sewing Non-sewing

Karen Riggins, Teacher

### Skill Level—Intermediate

The student will machine quilt a small piece that can then be turned into a vase. They will work with the following techniques:

- $\Rightarrow$  Free motion machine quilting with the design being inspired by the pattern in the fabric
- $\Rightarrow$  Quilting with metallic threads and other specialty threads
- $\Rightarrow$  Enhancing the piece with the use of water color and/or color pencils and fabric acrylic paints to add dimension and highlights to the quilted design.

The vase will finish out at about 9" around by 10" tall.

**Kits will be available that will include**: fabric hand dyed by the instructor, lining and batting, the use of colored pencils, fabric medium and acrylic paints, brushes, etc. \$10.00 per kit Spools of FS20 Metallic thread will be available for \$13.00 each.

#### If not getting the kit:

A 12" square of hand dyed or batik fabric Complimentary lining fabric, Batting A variety of specialty threads: metallic, etc. Watercolor and/or good quality colored pencils Small amounts of fabric paints Fabric medium, medium weight, be sure it is not flow medium Small paint brush Small plate for fabric medium

### W-2 PM Half Day

Hand Sewing

### Karen Riggins, Teacher Skill Level – Beginner to Intermediate

The student will create a sampler of stitches while exploring a variety of surface beading techniques such as bugle pathways, stacked stitch, seed stitch, flat fringe, lazy stitch, capturing a cabochon and backstitch. In addition, edge finishing fringe techniques will also be explored.

Correct technique along with an explanation of buying beads, what kinds of thread to use and how to stabilize a piece for beading are all part of the class. **Complete kit available from instructor -\$20.** 

#### **Optional supply list:**

At least 2 colors of #11 seed beads one color of #15 seed beads one or more colors of #8 seed beads a few #6 seed beads one or more colors of bugle beads -

6mm size

a variety of beads like leaves, flowers, insects, drops, etc.

Two-hole buttons that can be used as a cabochon optional: one or more cabochons

#10 sharp needles

a neutral color beading thread 1 beading base made up of an 8"-9" square that has been backed with an "iron on" interfacing. Hem 2 edges of the square. The other edges can be zigzagged.



**Optional:** Students, especially those with some beading experience, may like to bring a project that they would like to bead. Beading cloth: Only used to hold beads in place on the table. Can be an old kitchen cotton towel or piece of flannel. Huck cloth works great.

### **Tips and Techniques**

### Lynnette LeGette Teacher

### Skill Level—Advanced Beginner to Intermediate

This dynamite class is loaded with lots of "T and T" most requested by quilters. This Hands-On experience allows each participant to make samples of the techniques presented to keep for future reference. After this class, your accuracy in all aspects of quilting will greatly improve...guaranteed!!

Example of content: Preparing fabric for cutting, using a rotary cutter, maximize ruler capabilities, consistent seam allowances, pressing vs. ironing, squaring-up the quilt, measuring for borders, multiple borders, curved borders, mitered corners, use of piping and flanges, binding strips, two color binding, flange binding, binding curves and angles..... AND many, many more. This gives you the general idea.

Sewing Machine

### Mary Bauer, Teacher Skill Level—Confidant Beginner

Learn to make a whimsical Dresden plate variation that turns the wedges into a housing neighborhood. You can plan to make a single block and turn that into a pillow, or make three blocks for a fun holiday table runner and six blocks for a small quilt.

#### For a Pillow:

- Background fabric for a 20" pillow
- Scraps for the houses at least 4" x 8"
- Smaller scraps for the roof, doors, windows
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yd. of your favorite fusible
- 1/8 yd. Heat n Bond Ultra Hold

#### For Table Runner:

- 2 yds. Background & Backing
- 1/8 yd. each 11 to 12 different fabrics for houses and binding
- Scraps for the roofs, doors and windows
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> yd. Heat n Bond Lite
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yd. Heat n Bond Ultra Hold

#### For Small Quilt: list does not include backing

- 2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yds Background
- Assorted scraps for houses (minimum 4" x 8") roofs, doors, windows
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> yd Black & White Houses print
- 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yd Wonder Under

#### **Supplies**

- Sewing machine with a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" piecing foot and an open toe applique foot
- Paper & Fabric scissors
- Rotary for fabric and another for paper
- Monofilament thread
- Dresden ruler and/or freezer paper\*
- Normal sewing supplies
- Rotating cutting mat is helpful



#### **Preparation:**

Pre-wash all fabric that will be used with fusibles (roof, doors and windows).

\*Bring freezer paper if you wish to learn how to make a Dresden without a ruler.

# W-5Swing It!SewingFull DayTable Runner/Placemats Quilt-As-You-GoMachine

### Linda Stallings, Teacher Skill Level—Beginner

Curved shapes, bias strips, quilt-as-you-go, oh my! Students will learn a method of quilt-as-you-go, piecing and quilting in the same step, using templates to cut curved shapes, making bias strips and binding. Make the table runner as long as you like by making as few or as many units as you wish. The techniques learned with this method of quilting can be applied to other quilt patterns and designs. A pattern is required and can be purchased from the instructor for \$6.00. <u>Pattern</u>: Swing It! of *Designs to Share with You* by Ursula Riegel of Victoria, BC, Canada **Supplies** 

Fabric Requirements: For Table Runner 16" x 44"

Curved pentagons along the sides1/4 yd. eacCoordinate for diamonds and dome shapes3/8 yd.Bias strips and binding3/4 yd.Backing and batting(both 45" width)5/8 yd.\*To minimize frustration, directional prints probablynot suitable for first project attemptYardages providedare a minimum amount.Additional pieces may bepreferred for a scrappier look.

#### Tools & Notions

Machine with walking foot or  $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot, edge stitch foot optional, Scissors, Small rotary cutter, Rotary cutting mat Extra firm template plastic: 8" x 10" Long ruler: Used to cut strips,  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Clover or other bias tape maker, Batting: The use of fusible batting is ideal for this project as it speeds up the process some. Regular batting with a content of at least 50% natural fibers together with the use of a water-soluble glue stick works just as well. Polyester batting is not recommended.

Water soluble glue stick, Teflon sheet if using fusible batting Pen/pencils for marking, Fabric grips/sand paper dots for templates, Thread: Match to bias strip fabric, Smoke colored monofilament (optional), Pins, machine needles, seam ripper and other sewing utensils

1/4 yd. each of two fabrics



### Sit and Sew

Sit and Sew is an opportunity to work on projects without guidance or instruction. Tables and chairs will be available. Bring any equipment and supplies you need to complete your project including lights, irons, boards, and extension cords. This environment gives you a chance to get to know fellow KHQS quilters while making progress on your own projects. It's also a great time to work on the project from the class you took the day before (or the year before!)

\*We recommend bringing lights.



### **Color Theory for Quilters**

#### Wednesday evening lecture at 7 PM.



This lecture will address key concepts for quilters related to the selection and use of color in quilting. Topics will include the following: The Color Wheel: history and composition of the color wheel; Color Schemes: combinations that work, and fixing those that don't; Value: why light vs. dark is actually more important than color; Temperature: the visual and emotional effects of colors and Proportions: some colors are timid, others are bullies, learn to manage them so that they all play well together. Suitable for any level.

Just four easy steps, no Y seams and no fabric waste. Change the look by changing the fabric! Use precut 5" Charms or cut your own.

Pattern & Template \$19 Pattern only \$8

- 120 5" squares of black fabric (2 ¼ yards)
- Three 5" squares in each of 40 colors for a total of 120 squares
- Or 40 5" squares in each of 3 colors
- Or 120 multi-color squares
- ½ yard for binding & 1 5/8yard backing fabric – not needed for class

Rotary Cutter and small cutting mat

Iron and small pressing mat

### **Playing with Stripes**



### Mary Bauer, Teacher Skill Level—Beginner and up

Learn how to use stripe fabric to create different designs. You can use your own pieced strata or stripe fabric off the shelf. It can be a regular stripe, a faux stripe, an irregular stripe – they will all produce their own design. Make placemats, a table runner, a wall hanging, lap throw or a full-size bed quilt.

#### **Supplies:**

Sewing machine, basic sewing supplies, rotary cutter, cutting mat, ruler, 50 or 60 wt. neutral piecing thread.

#### Fabric:

Depending on the size project desired you will need up to 3 yards of striped fabric for the center of the quilt.

#### **Preparation:**

If you want to use pieced strata, please have a sufficient amount of strata pieced before class to be ready to cut for the class quilt.



TH-3 Full Day

### Hand Embroidery Techniques-Part 2

### Hand Sewing

Roxanne Ferguson Skill Level—Beginner and up

We will be working on mastering additional hand embroidery stitches using floss, Perl cotton and yarns. Some stitches look great with the addition of small seed beads. Your pieced or appliqued blocks can now be embellished with as much charm as you desire. These techniques work well on cottons, wools or exotic fabrics. No sewing machine is required. You do not have to have taken Part 1 to enroll in this Part 2 offering. Complete supply list

Two - 10" squares of background fabric (or good quality muslin) squares that have been stabilized with an iron-on light-weight stabilizer. Baste the layers together with a 1/4" seam all along the outer edge. This will keep the layers together and your stitches from puckering.

Assorted Needles- Be sure that your threads, floss, yarn and Perl cotton can be easily threaded through the eyes-but not so thick that they are hard to pull through your fabric. They need to be sharp enough to pierce through two layers of fabric. #22 to #24 Crewel needles work well. Thin needles are needed to go through the small seed beads if you want to add any beads to your stitches—straw needles work well here.



**Assorted** Threads- Use colors that coordinate but show up nicely. Include some variegated threads so you can see the effect of color changes. Six-strand embroidery floss, #8 and #12 Perl cottons, metallic threads, yarns for couching and matching sewing thread for couching them down. Beads require beading thread. If you do not have this bring some polyester 50 weight sewing thread to match your beads.

**Notions**- Needle threader, small, sharp embroidery scissors, seam ripper, thimble, marking pencils and eraser, small ruler, additional lighting and a hoop if desired. **Embellishments**- Small seed beads with a small container to corral them, ribbons, wool appliques.

### **Improvisational Piecing**

Sewing Machine

Ashley Bandy, Teacher

All Skill Levels

No plan? No problem! Loosen up with a free-form, truly improvisational project. Learn how to create your own pieced fabric with gentle, free-form curves and mix various techniques to create a small wall hanging. Participants should leave with a finished project, depending on the complexity of the piece.

#### **Supplies:**

Sewing machine Machine needles Hand needles Thread for piecing Thread for appliqué (or some double-sided fusible!)

### **Quilting with Templates**

Sewing Machine

Linda Cronwell

### Skill Level—Intermediate

This class is for those wanting to learn how to use templates for quilting on your home sewing machine. Students will have hands on experiences creating designs using templates by Quilter's Rule. Each student must know basic sewing and must bring a machine in good working condition. You MUST have a <u>round</u> free motion foot on your machine. Prior to the class, you will need to know how to drop your feet dogs.

#### Supplies

A set of 2 ruler templates are is required and can be purchased from the instructor for

\$32.75. If you already have templates, it is unnecessary to purchase another set.

- Round free motion foot or ruler foot
- Sewing machine in good working order
- Sewing gloves
- 2 16x16 muslin sandwiches basted, not pinned
- 24" strip cutter ruler
- Pencil
- Marking pencil
- Contrasting cotton thread
- Size 14 or 16 machine needles
- Add-a-table or large sewing surface

### A Touch of Summer, Continued

### Hand Sewing

### Judy Hobbs, Teacher Skill Level—Any Skill Level

This class is a continuation of the class, "A Touch of Summer". You do not have the first class to take this one. In this class you will learn the basics of how to make different 3-dimensional flowers and grapes using wool applique. Decorative embroidery stitches, as well as beads, will be incorporated to embellish your flowers. Once you learn these techniques you will be able to adapt these flowers to other quilts you create. You will only need a machine to sew your completed blocks together. The class work will be all hand sewing.

Supply List:

A kit will be sold for \$10, which will contain the wool needed for the flower/grapes construction and some beads for floral embellishment.

#### Material:

You will need a background fabric (I used a cream that reads solid. Something that is a neutral that will go with any colored flowers).

Cut the following size pieces for background: one 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 14  $\frac{1}{2}$ " piece and two 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces.

Thread—# 12 pearl cotton or embroidery floss in a dark green, invisible (clear) thread, gold sewing thread, neutral, strong thread such as quilting thread

Needles: I use wool applique #22 or #24 chenille needle (or any needles that have a big enough eye to accommodate the embroidery floss or thicker thread)

Fusible–Soft Fuse, Steam a Seam, or Wonder Under

Marking pens and pencil

Light box-if you have one, I will bring mine

Iron, scissors, glue stick, basic sewing supplies, no machine



F-4 Full Day

### Nines & X's: Scraps and More

#### Donna Duncan, Teacher

### Skill Level—Confident Beginner, Intermediate

Two simple blocks set alternately are the basis for this multi-fabric quilt. Bring that boxful of scraps, or that stack of coordinated fat quarters or that Jelly Roll that you have been saving for "something special." In this workshop, you'll get a good start on this easy-to-piece quilt for your den or bedroom, or for a gift. This design is easily adaptable to any size – lap size, nap size, twin-bed size, or larger. Some pre-cutting directions will be provided prior to the workshop for those who wish to get a jump-start on their class work.

#### Fabrics: Yardages are for a 70" x 70" nap quilt.

Scrap fabrics to total 3 yards – You may choose to use jelly rolls, layer cakes, fat quarters, or odd-sized scraps. We will be cutting strips and squares  $2\frac{1}{2}$  wide, so scraps should be large enough to do that. One Jelly Roll will be enough to make the 70" x 70" quilt.

4 yards background fabric – This can be one background fabric, for a unified look, or a collection of one tone (such as several cream prints, or several yellow prints, or several pink prints, etc.) for a "unified scrappy" look) Your background fabric may be light, as in the illustration, or it may be dark. The main thing to remember is that there should be appropriate contrast (either high contrast, or moderate contrast) between the background fabric and the scraps. So . . . light background and medium and dark scraps . . . OR . . . dark background and medium and light scraps Donna usually prewashes her fabrics. However, with jelly rolls, that's simply not practicable.


**Hints:** To estimate quilters' cotton, generally a pound of fabric is three or four yards. If you are using scraps, more is better (generally). So, bring extra – but don't bring a closetful! You'll just frustrate yourself! If you have a hefty pound of scraps, that

should be sufficient.

#### **Supplies:**

Thread & Scissors

- Sewing machine in good working order. Extension cord, power strip
- Iron and ironing surface (two or more can share)
- Seam ripper, Pins, Pencil and paper for notetaking
- Rotary cutter and mat, Acrylic quilter's ruler 12" Square acrylic ruler
- Pencils to mark fabrics-whatever works best on your fabrics) Rotating cutting mat, at least 14"x14", if you have one. Don't purchase just for class.

#### History

In 1981, a group of quilt lovers, quilt makers and quilt collectors joined together to form the Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society, the first statewide organization to be concerned with all aspects of quilting throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Since that small beginning, our individual membership has grown with members in almost every county and almost 50 affiliate guilds. Purpose

To promote understanding, appreciation and knowledge of the art and craft of quilt making.

To support and expand the collection and preservation of Kentucky quilts and the records of Kentucky quilt makers and their work.

To undertake such activities as shows, contests and educational workshops.

The Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society is an equal opportunity organization whose membership enrollment does not discriminate on the basis of gender, age, race, or religion.

Activities

Workshops are held at the annual KHQS Meeting & Getaway in June. Each fall, quilters gather with a nationally known teacher for the three-day KHQS Quilting Adventures.

KHQS, along with QAK and KHAS hold several retreats throughout the year.

Quilt Registry Days are held in counties across Kentucky. From these, information of use to the academic and museum world is collected and stored at the Kentucky Museum in Bowling Green.

KHQS has organized 13 districts across the state. District Leaders create the link between local, state, and national quilters. National Quilting Day, which had its beginnings in Kentucky, is celebrated on the third Saturday in March. KHQS Districts celebrate this special

day with Quilters' Day Out events in each district across the state.

In 1995, the Kentucky Heritage Appliqué Society (KHAS) was formed as an auxiliary group of KHQS. Its purpose is to promote the techniques, appreciation and preservation of hand and machine appliqué. In 2004, the Quilt Artists of Kentucky (QAK) formed with the purpose to serve as a support and information group for innovative quilters who choose to practice creativity with quilts as an art form; to educate about the art of the quilt; and explore venues for art quilt exhibition. <u>Members of</u> these groups must also be members of KHOS.

KHQS actively works to keep the art and craft of quilt making alive by providing judges, teachers and demonstrations at shows and special events. KHQS offers financial assistance to affiliate guilds who hold quilt shows. Scholarships are offered for the annual Quilting Adventures. Each year members can participate in quilt block contests and a quilt challenge. The challenge quilts then become a traveling exhibit viewed by thousands of people over the course of a year. Newsletter

The newsletter is published four times a year for the membership. The newsletter is full of information about the quilting world, up-coming shows and exhibits, free patterns and, of course, up-to-date information on all KHQS activities. Dues

Individual KHQS membership dues are \$20.00 annually. Guilds and quilt clubs may also join as KHQS Affiliates for an annual fee of \$15.00. Dues for the Kentucky Heritage Appliqué Society and Quilt Artists of Kentucky are both \$5.00 annually. Contributions are always welcome. Individual members are given discounts to lectures workshops hosted by the Society.
