History

In 1981, a group of quilt lovers, quilt makers and quilt collectors joined together to form the Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society, the first statewide organization to be concerned with all aspects of quilting throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Since that small beginning, our individual membership has grown with members in almost every county and almost 50 affiliate guilds.

Purpose

To promote understanding, appreciation and knowledge of the art and craft of quilt making.

To support and expand the collection and preservation of Kentucky quilts and the records of Kentucky quilt makers and their work.

To undertake such activities as shows, contests and educational workshops.

The Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society is an equal opportunity organization whose membership enrollment does not discriminate on the basis of gender, age, race, or religion.

Activities

Workshops are held at the annual KHQS Meeting & Getaway in June. Each fall, quilters gather with a nationally known teacher for the three-day KHQS Quilting Adventures.

KHQS, along with QAK and KHAS hold several retreats throughout the year.

Quilt Registry Days are held in counties across Kentucky. From these, information of use to the academic and museum world is collected and stored at the Kentucky Museum in Bowling Green.

KHQS has organized 13 districts across the state. District Leaders create the link between local, state, and national quilters. National Quilting Day, which had its beginnings in Kentucky, is celebrated on the third Saturday in March. KHQS Districts celebrate this special day with Quilters' Day Out events in each district across the state.

In 1995, the Kentucky Heritage Appliqué Society (KHAS) was formed as an auxiliary group of KHQS. Its purpose is to promote the techniques, appreciation and preservation of hand and machine appliqué. In 2004, the Quilt Artists of Kentucky (QAK) formed with the purpose to serve as a support and information group for innovative quilters who choose to practice creativity with quilts as an art form; to educate about the art of the quilt; and explore venues for art quilt exhibition. *Members of these groups must also be members of KHQS*.

KHQS actively works to keep the art and craft of quilt making alive by providing judges, teachers and demonstrations at shows and special events. KHQS offers financial assistance to affiliate guilds who hold quilt shows. Scholarships are offered for the annual Quilting Adventures. Each year members can participate in quilt block contests and a quilt challenge. The challenge quilts then become a traveling exhibit viewed by thousands of people over the course of a year.

Newsletter

The newsletter is published four times a year for the membership. The newsletter is full of information about the quilting world, up-coming shows and exhibits, free patterns and, of course, up-to-date information on all KHQS activities.

Dues

Individual KHQS membership dues are \$20.00 annually. Guilds and quilt clubs may also join as KHQS Affiliates for an annual fee of \$15.00. Dues for the Kentucky Heritage Appliqué Society and Quilt Artists of Kentucky are both \$5.00 annually. Contributions are always welcome. Individual members are given discounts to lectures workshops hosted by the Society.

General Schedule Information

Entangled Sky All Skill levels



Entangled Sky is made entirely out of 2 1/2" strips and is deceptively easy to assemble. All the magic happens in the three shades of each color, in light, medium, and dark. Constructed essentially from two different blocs, get a 3D affect by arranging the A and B blocks to meet each other. Achieve a complicated architectural look without all the fussy piecing and no Y seams. Come learn from Krista all the tips and tricks for cutting and piecing trapezoids and triangles in an easy, fast and precise way. If you have been wanting to break out of the same out routine and try something new, this class will inspire confidence and equip you with new techniques.

- Sewing machine in good working order
- 1/4" foot for your sewing machine
- rotary cutter, ruler, and mat
- Basic sewing supplies, scissors (large and small), seam ripper, straight pins
- Thread
- Fabric marking pen
- Creative Grids LARGE 60° diamond ruler (cuts up to 8½")
- Entangled Sky Pattern

Fabric Requirements

5/8 yd each of 3 shades of purple: light, medium and dark.

5/8 yd each of 3 shades of coral: light, medium and dark.

5/8 yd each of 3 shades of gold: light, medium and dark.

1/4 yd each of 3 shades of blue: light, medium and dark.

Pre Cutting

(all strips are cut selvage to selvage)

Note: if you want to precut your strips

before class to save time, you will need:

- (2) 2½" strips from each blue sky fabric.
- (7) 2½" strips from each shade of purple fabric, light, medium and dark
- (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from each shade of coral fabric, light, medium and dark
- (7) 21/2" strips from each shade of gold fabric, light medium and dark

Double Struck Star All Skill levels



This cheerful modern quilt is a great stash buster! Come learn from Krista all the tips and tricks for cutting and piecing triangles in an easy, fast, and precise way. If you have been want to try something different, this class is for you! Use up all those fat quarters and stray 2 1/2" strips you have laying around. Entirely strip pieced, this quilt is easy enough for the confident beginner. The colors grade from light to dark so the star looks like its bursting. This quilt was designed with kids in mind; jazz up their bedroom or change the colors and make it patriotic!

Supply List:

- Sewing machine in good working order
- 1/4" foot for your machine
- Rotary cutter, and mat
- Basic sewing supplies, scissor (large and small), seam ripper, straight pins
- Thread to match fabric
- 60° Diamond Creative Grids LARGE Diamond Ruler (cuts up to 8½")
- Double Struck Star Pattern

Fabric requirements

- (6) green fat quarters, ranging light to dark
- (6) turquoise fat quarters, ranging light to dark
- (6) orange fat quarters, ranging light to dark
- 3 yds of white for background, or 5/8 yd of 6 different neutrals for a varied background.
- ¼ yd gray for star "shadow" border
- ½ yd binding fabric
- 3½ yds backing fabric

Pre Cutting

Note: if you want to precut before class to save time you will need:

- (11) 6½" strips of your background neutrals
- (10) 3" strips of your background neutrals
- (5) 1½" strips of gray fabric
- (2) 2½" strips from each fat quarter and (1) 6½" strip from each fat quarter

Semaphore Stripes All Skill levels



Made with 2 1/2" strips!! Are you looking for a great way to use stripes? The Semaphore Stripes quilt is the perfect way to use striped fabric to make a secondary design without all the complicated piecing striped typically required—AND it is jelly roll friendly! This quilt combines strip-piecing with a few well placed Y-seams (not scary) to get the most dramatic effect. The pieces are large and uncomplicated, letting the fabric do the talking. Come learn from Krista all the tips and tricks for cutting and piecing diamonds in an easy, fast and precise way. If you have been wanting to try something new and

different, this class is for you!

Supply List:

What to bring to class

- Sewing machine in good working order
- 1/4" foot for your sewing machine
- rotary cutter, ruler, and mat
- Basic sewing supplies, scissors (large and small), seam ripper, straight pins
- Thread to match background fabric
- Fabric marking pen
- Creative Grids 60° LARGE diamond ruler (cuts up to 8½")
- Semaphore Stripe Pattern

- (38) 2½" colored strips (jelly rolls are perfect) or ¼ yd of
- (13) different colored fabrics
- (38) 2½" striped fabric strips or 1½ yds each of two different striped fabrics You can use as few or as many different striped fabrics as you like, it would look just as good with only one!

2 yds solid white fabric cut into (68) 1" strips

Pre Cutting

Note: if you want to precut your strips before class to save time, you will need:

- (38) 21/2" colored strips and (38) 21/2" striped fabric strips. You will also need
- (68) 1" white strips

This quilt pattern grew out of a love of color and the need to get a quilt top done quickly. Using your jelly roll for color inspiration, we will use organizational and short cut techniques to make this rather complex looking quilt come together easily. Add the borders to make it the right size for your needs, and it's done. Jane will walk you through how to plan, construct, and complete this quilt perfect for a baby or lap quilt. Bonus: Jane will give you ideas for using

Pattern Fee: \$4.00 If you don't have time to purchase a jelly roll, Jane will have several in different color ways from which to choose at the workshop. Contact Jane if you want to reserve one ahead of time. \$30 for a Kona 40 piece roll.

Supply List

Neutral sewing thread to blend with fabrics (I used light grey) Rotary Cutter, mat, ruler

Seam Ripper

Iron and pressing mat

Spray Starch (your choice, it makes working with those skinny pieces easier) Fine point permanent marker or pencil Straight pins

Fabric for 51" x 54"

1 jelly roll with 40 - 2 1/2" strips. I used Kona's Mermaid Shores Palette. Choose a jelly roll with at least 20 different colors. I suggest solids, something that reads as solid, or a batik collection in palettes that blend from one color to the next. Jelly rolls in many color palettes are available at your local quilt store, favorite on-line store, and Amazon.

Don't open your roll until class!

1 yard of neutral color for filler strips* - I used a grey in this quilt.
1 yard of a color that coordinates with your jelly's palette. This can be the same or different from the color of your strips. This will make a quilt 51" x 54". If you'd like a bigger quilt, figure that into your yardage.
1/2 yard for binding is not required for class
3 3/4 yards for backing are not required for class.

Bio—Jane Adolf

Jane's mother taught her how to throw a baseball, not how to sew. So, Jane didn't start her quilting journey until she retired from teaching in 2010. Since that time, her quilts and gourd art have won many ribbons at the Shelby County and Kentucky State Fairs, and two of her quilts have appeared on Fons and Porter's Love of Quilting. Jane has taught numerous quilting classes on-site as well as virtually during the last several years. Her small business, Sweet Waddy Jane, has become an outlet for her creative endeavors as well as a great excuse to buy more fabric. She is a member of KHQS, AQS, Louisville Modern Quilting Guild, and Kentucky Cover Lovers.

In this class you will learn a no hassle method for sewing circles using the



decorative stitches on your sewing machine. No special attachment is required for this class; however, if you own a circle attachment you may bring and use it. The attachment does not limit the diameter of your circles. This is a fun way to experiment with decorative stitches, with different colors and kinds of thread. You will learn to prepare your block so it will rotate on its own and to appliqué circles on to a

background using decorative stitches. This is a fast and fun way to make a quick child's gift or a charity quilt and use those odds and ends of fabric that are really pretty and fun not enough for a major project.

Bio - Vicky Hartley was inspired by her great aunt who taught her to hand embroider as a teenager and later taught her to hand piece her first quilt top, Tumbling Blocks, in 1980. After many years of craft sewing, hand embroidery was still her passion until she discovered and purchased her first sewing and embroidery machine in 1995. 



Let Judy know in advance if you want to make a boy paper doll quilt.



Were you one of those children who played with paper dolls when you were young? Create a paper doll quilt and share those memories with a special young girl (or boy). In this class we will construct a paper doll quilt. Using a pattern, you will create your doll, fuse it to your background, paint her face, and begin making various outfits in which to dress your doll. You may choose the hair style (long or short) and color of hair matching the person for whom the quilt is created. Your doll will be dressed in its underwear on the quilt. The rest of the

class we will follow basic patterns to create a wardrobe for the doll, including shoes, hair bows, jewelry, etc. Let your creativity soar!

Supply List:

- 1.Background material–1 yard of 45" wide, a light neutral material that will go well with the various colors of the doll clothes (I used a light blue green marbled material).
- 2. ½ yard for borders-choose a dark color that will frame your quilt
- 3. 1/3 yard of flesh color–I used light peach
- 4. 5 yards of lightweight iron on interfacing
- 5. 1/3 yard of fusible—my favorite is Soft Fuse (cont. on next page . . .)

Paper Dolls, continued

- 6. Package of sew on velcro, which we will attach to doll clothes
- 7. Various colors and types of material from which to make clothing corduroy for jumpers, pants. Cotton for shirts, dresses, pants, etc. flannel for pjs, Wool for a coat, jacket, or jumper hair color. Blue jean–everyone needs jeans or a jacket, seasonal material for Christmas or Halloween dresses. Bring your scraps. Use your imagination!
- 8. Material for your cat (10" x 6")
- 9. 1/4 yard of material for the box (where you will store your clothes) plus a large button for the box (see the picture)
- 10. Thread to match all your different material
- 11. Any kind of trims that you can use to embellish your clothing. This could include buttons of all sizes, ribbon, lace, small rick rack, beads, elastic, etc. **NOTE: All clothing for doll will need a piece of material no larger than 12**' x **14**". **Use up your scraps!**
- 12. Paper and fabric scissors, pencil for tracing
- 13. Iron
- 15. BSS-machine in good working order

Bio – Judy Hobbs has been sewing and making clothes for herself and her family since junior high school. She took her first quilting class in the early 1990s and has been "hooked" ever since. She is a member of AQS, KHQS, IQA, Graves County Piecemakers, Paducah Stitch and Quilt, and Quilt Lovers of Murray. Throughout the years she has taught classes and given programs for various guilds and held several offices. She had one of her quilts included in the book, *Playing with Triangles*, and featured on the book's cover. Judy has completed several commissioned quilts and has had quilts in several shows. She has had quilts in the 2009 through 2011 AQS Knoxville Quilt Show, winning a 1st and 2nd place, and as a quilt in the 2012 Grand Rapids Quilt Show. She has had 2 of her quilts exhibited in the National Quilt Museum. Her quilt, Cherry Blossom Dreams, won best of show in the Graves County Art Guild Impressions 2014 show.

This workshop will focus on the variety of embellishments that can be added to quilted pieces, using sewing machine and some hand techniques. The students will create small samplers of the techniques.

The techniques will include:

- Bobbin work with decorative threads
- Free motion zig zag quilting and applique'
- Using Angelina fibers to create butterflies,
- dragonflies, etc.
- Using heat with tyvek
- Quilting with metallic threads
- Creating applique's with Evolon and colored pencils
- Binding the edges with metallic thread and satin stitch.

SUPPLIES:

A minimum of 2 sets of $8'' \times 10''$ pieces of three layers, ready to be quilted and embellished. These will be practice pieces. I recommend that the top layer be just one piece of neutral background fabric, such as a mono-tone batik.

Online Registration – Your Questions Answered
